


## A Better Tomorrow for Your Community

We're proud to share the 2024 ONE Gas Foundation Impact Report, highlighting how we're making a difference across our communities in Kansas, Oklahoma and Texas. Through the ONE Gas Foundation, our parent company invested more than \$2.5 million in grants, including support for public schools, nonprofit organizations and United Way campaigns. In celebration of ONE Gas' 10-year anniversary, employees helped direct special \$10,000 grants to local nonprofits, and their generosity didn't stop there — they volunteered more than 10,000 hours last year. ## Community Spotlights

In Woodward, we helped bring hands-on learning to life with a grant to Woodward High School. Our support provided tools and equipment for students to explore careers in construction, carpentry and woodworking — giving them valuable skills and confidence in the trades.

We also supported the revitalization of the Oklahoma chapter of the American Association of Blacks in Energy (AABE), providing annual funding for scholarships that encourage high school seniors to pursue careers in the energy sector.

Additionally, we funded a grant for the Family Shelter of Southern Oklahoma in Ardmore to help provide critical support and resources to individuals and families affected by domestic violence.



## 5 Tips to Stay Cool and Save Money This Summer

- Run dryers, dishwashers and other large appliances at night.
- Seal doors and windows to keep cool air in and warm air out.
- Check all vents to ensure they're open and dust-free.
- Switch to a low-flow showerhead and install a faucet aerator to reduce water and energy usage.
- Save energy and money by upgrading to highefficiency natural gas appliances.



## Claim Your Free Water-Saving Kit

Low-flow showerheads can save the average family up to 3,300 gallons of water per year. Plus, you can save up to \$220\* in natural gas costs. This free kit is limited to one eligible residential customer account per calendar year and will be distributed on a first-come, first-served basis while supplies last.

\*Approximate bill savings over 10-year life of the water kit. Based on average 2024 Oklahoma water and natural gas costs.



Your kids are out of school for the summer and spending more time around the house. With additional time spent with family, this is a great time to talk about natural gas safety.

Here are some tips you can share with them:

- When an adult is cooking on a stove, the flame should be blue, not orange. If you see it is orange, tell the adult immediately.
- While natural gas appliances can look fun, they're not toys. Don't play with knobs, switches or any part of the appliance.
- Natural gas smells like rotten eggs. This helps detect if there's a leak. If you smell natural gas, leave the area immediately, tell an adult and contact 911, then Oklahoma Natural Gas at 800-458-4251.
- You have a meter outside that delivers natural gas into your home. It looks like a gray box with dials and pipes leading out of it. Do not play around the meter or place items on top of it.
- Playing in the dirt can be fun, but it's important to dig safely to avoid damaging these pipelines underground. If an adult is about to dig, they should contact 811 at least 48 hours, excluding the date of notification, weekends and holidays, before starting.
